Capstone poster: You will present the results of your capstone research in a poster. Your poster is due electronically, in pdf format, on Wednesday, April 23, one week prior to the poster presentation.

The poster session will be Wednesday, April 30, 4:00 - 5:00pm. Please mark this date and time on your calendar today!

External judges: The poster presentation will be reviewed by external judges (not me). The results of the judges' scores will be included in your final grade.
