Homework: Homework will be conducted using the textbook publisher's *Mastering Physics* system. An access code should have been bundled with the textbook if you bought it at the campus bookstore. Otherwise, you may register on-line. The course ID is: **PHY201SPRING2018** Note that the access code and the course ID are **NOT** the same thing. The access code is what proves you have paid to use the system. The course ID tells the system which course to put you in. To repeat: **the access code is NOT the same thing as the course ID.**

With two exceptions, homework will be due on Fridays, as shown on the course schedule.

A Few Notes on Homework: Please do the homework. Please allow enough time on the homework so that you can think about your responses and pay close attention to the questions. It is not intended to be mere busy work but is instead an important part of the learning experience. Believe it or not, education research has been conducted to show what may be obvious - students who do the homework for themselves (not copying off of someone else or looking up the answers on-line) do much better in the course.

I can't make you do the homework. I can't make sure that you always do it for yourself. But I can guarantee that you will severely lower your chances of getting a good grade, or even passing, if you don't do the homework. So, please do the homework.

Quizzes: A short quiz based on the previous week's homework will be conducted at the beginning of class on Tuesdays (with one exception; see course schedule). The quiz will end at 15 minutes after the hour. Anyone arriving late will have less time to complete the quiz, or will not be allowed to take it. The lowest quiz grade will be dropped.

Final Exam: The final exam *will* be cumulative.
